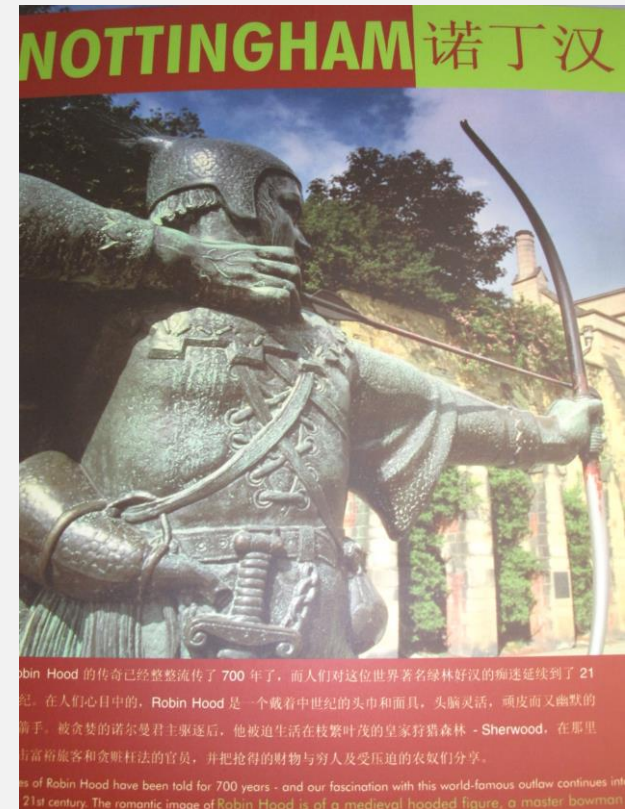

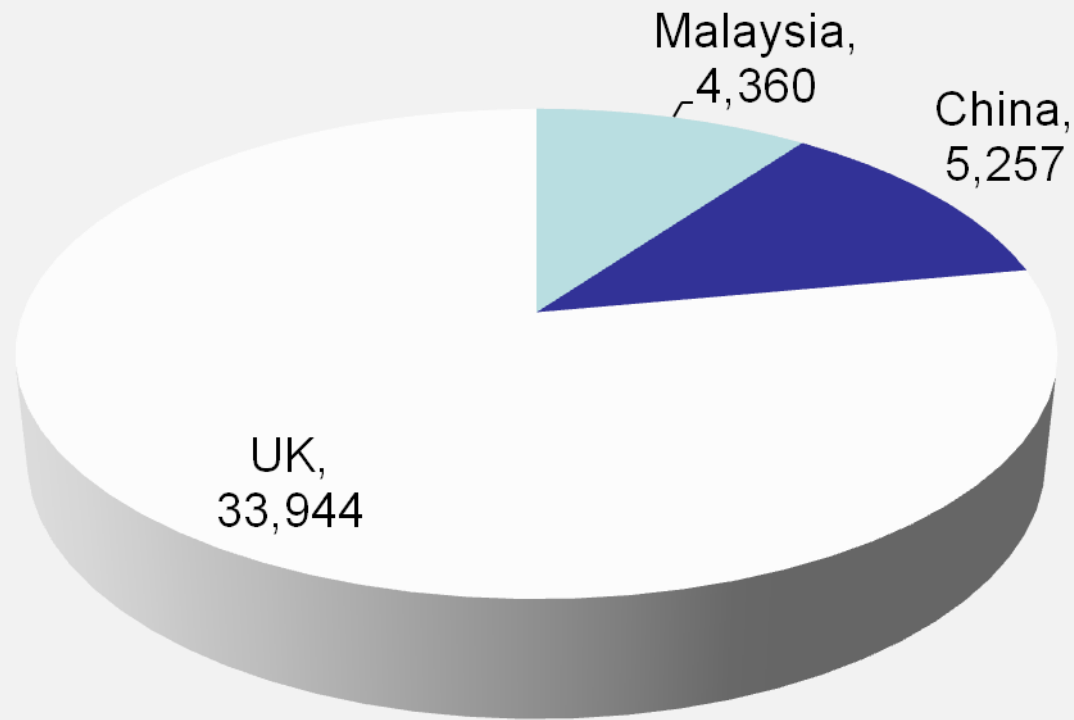


Setup

Student population

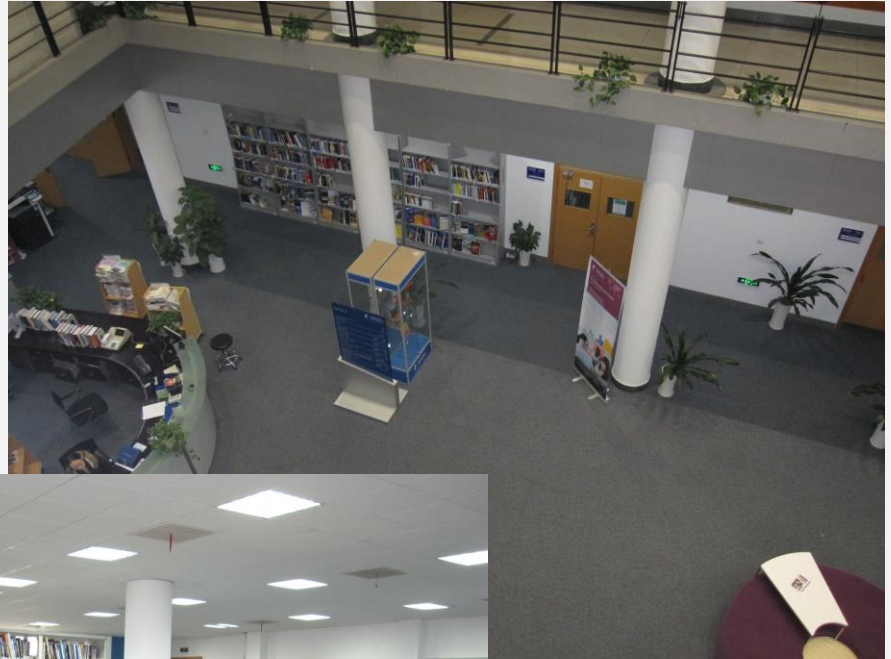


Faculty Structure

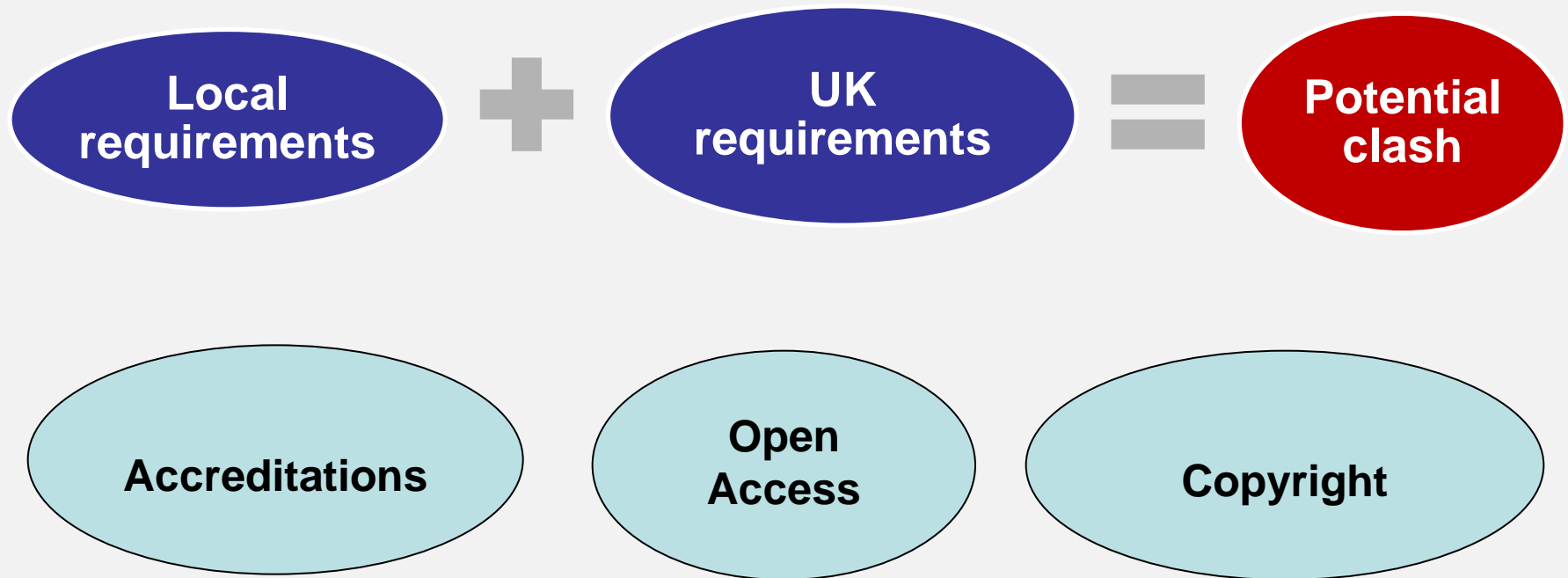

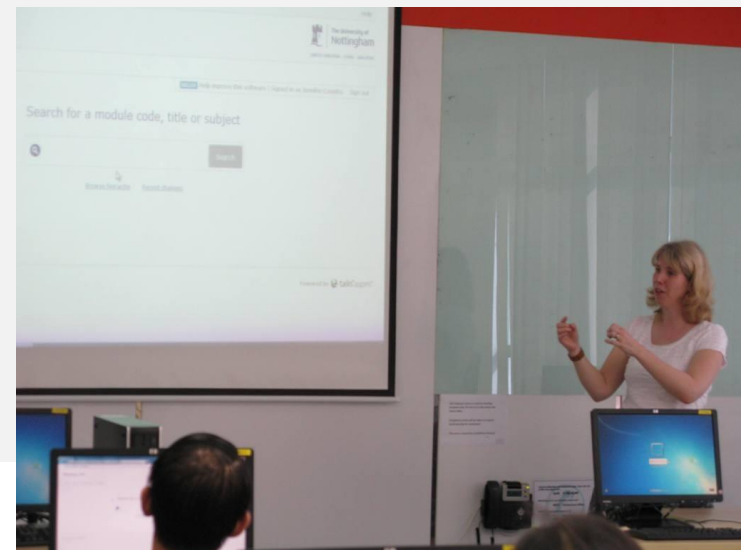
Challenges: Collections
