Technical & Medical Sciences	These are the obvious areas where standards are common in the workplace.
Business	Standards can be essential for business students as a tool of management.
Politics/Public Administration	Standards can be tools to stimulate industry performance and promote best practice without the need to legislate.
Economics	As the economy has changed from industrial to knowledge so has standardisation, meaning it can interlink with economic study.
Law	It is commonly misconceived that standardisation is a legislative activity. It isn't. It's a voluntary benchmarking of best practice. That said, standards have had an impact on legislature, either becoming law or used in legal cases. This knowledge of can help broaden the social understanding of standardisation.
